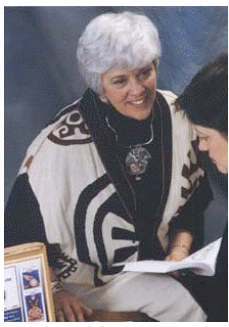

- The All Faiths Church of Spirituality and Health, a Missouri Corporation, becomes the new church sponsor for HU.

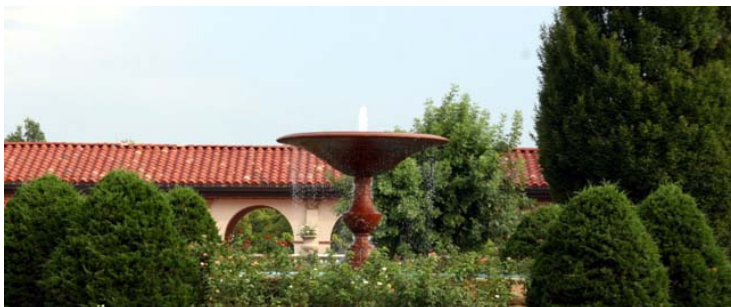
The HU Catalog and Web site will be updated to reflect these changes within the month of April. The community will be notified when a current Catalog reflecting these changes is posted to the Website.

UNITY VILLAGE CAMPUS



Classrooms-Unity Village

Unity Village is located 15 miles southeast of downtown Kansas City, Missouri, and is the spiritual home and headquarters for Unity Worldwide and Unity's School of Ministry. The Mediterranean-style campus includes 1400 acres of beautiful countryside including formal gardens, an extensive metaphysical library, bookstore, and the Unity Village Chapel. We are especially delighted with the library and the archives to which HU students will have access. The classrooms that HU will use for most of its residencies are located just to the right of the arches behind the rose garden fountain.



Fillmore Chapel – Unity Village

HU Campus Week on the Unity Campus will be held in October and April and will begin Sunday afternoon in the Fillmore Chapel with the HU Graduation and Ordination celebrations. All students, faculty, alumni, friends are welcome.

Unity Village is easily accessible to Kansas City International Airport. A shuttle is available between the airport and Unity Village campus. There are on-campus room and board accommodations to fit almost every budget. Everything students, faculty, and alumni will need to participate in Campus Week is located in easy walking distance on campus.

Fillmore Chapel: Restored to its beautiful 1929 appearance, the historic Fillmore Chapel seats 150 guests. This special chapel features beautiful hand-painted artwork and adjustable lighting. The raised stage allows guests to see the ceremony.

We are so pleased that HU has been so warmly welcomed by the administration at Unity. The Unity Village Campus provides a beautiful sacred space for the HU community to come together twice a year for ceremony, classes, and alumni reunions. Alumni are invited to attend "HU Campus Week" for meetings and to participate in residencies on a space available basis. ***Alumni and participants from the Unity and Kansas City communities will have an opportunity to pay a fee of \$75.00 per day to participate in residencies. In this way alumni and others can contribute to the well-being of HU while enhancing their own on-going education.*** Students will be able to take advantage of concurrent residencies in order to fulfill several residency requirements in one economical trip. Examples of daily on-campus room rates are: \$89.00 single - \$52.00 double for the elegant Conference Hotel and \$54.00 single - \$34.50 double for a small motel room. There are also economical rates for hotel suites, a large motel room, and a very minimal rate for shared-bath "cottages". A cafeteria is available for meals or basic meal package is available. The 2009 – 2010 Schedules are on the following page. Most campus residencies are held to a maximum of three days so that there can be two consecutive sessions from Monday through Saturday.

ORDINATION POLICY

Ordination is available to graduates of the HU Masters or Doctoral programs as well as to current students in either program who have fulfilled the following minimal requirements:

- Masters Students: Successful completion of the HU Masters program.
- Doctoral Students: Successful completion of 36 credit hours at HU.
- Completed courses must include core course, 757-The Theology of Holism,
- Students must submit their completed applications to the Registrar by the deadline posted on the HU Website Calendar.
- All persons to be ordained must be present at an ordination ceremony (held at Unity Village in Missouri in October or April) and will be expected to sign an acceptance of the statement of Faith.

ADDITIONAL ORDINATION INFORMATION

The All Faiths Church for Spirituality and Health will also open ordination to HU Faculty and to persons who received a Masters or Doctorate degree from HU's predecessors, Greenwich University and Holos University Graduate Studies. After May 1st and before July 1st, 2009 you may apply for the Fall, 2009 Ordination by contacting: registrar@holosuniversity.org

ISMCSH

From 2001 to the present, the International Science of Mind Church for Spiritual Healing (ISMCSH) served as HU's sponsoring church and many HU students were ordained in this church. Dr. Shealy has kept open this option for future ordination in this church for those who have fulfilled the requirements. Ordination will take place twice each year at noon on the last Sunday in August and the last Sunday in March. Students must apply at least one month in advance, present their transcripts indicating the completion of a minimum of 36 HU credit hours to include the three specially required courses, and students must be present for the ceremony at the Holos Building in Fair Grove, MO. 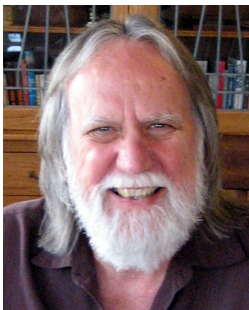
