# **Course Description**

This course lays the foundation for traditional understanding of health care and provides a basic introduction to Western Medical terms and terminology. The language utilized in the discourse of western medicine tests, standard treatments, follow-up care, and health care referrals will be identified.

## **Purpose of the Course**

The purpose of this class is to provide students with an overview of general health care practices and expose students to the training and practices of western medicine or conventional medicine by holders of M.D. (medical doctor) or D.O. (doctor of osteopathy) and DC (doctor of chiropractic) degrees and their allied health professionals, such as physical therapists, psychologists, and registered nurses. Students also learn how to speak, write, and understand scientific and medical language, especially in the maintenance of clinical records.

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## **Learning Objectives**

- Identify the three word elements used in medical terms
- Analyze, pronounce, and spell medical terms using common combining forms, suffixes, and prefixes
- Identify pertinent abbreviations and their meanings used in health care
- Relay relevant anatomy and physiology terminology related to organs and tissues in the body
- Incorporate this information to interpret and record medical records
- Describe the training and practice of physicians and specialty medical practices
- Study the biomedical clinical concepts, treatment procedures, and diagnostic procedures and collaborate care where appropriate to enhance the quality of Oriental Medical care provided, as well as make appropriate referrals
